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Latest Inhalant Anesthesia



We now offer Sevoflurane inhalant anesthesia for your pets under going surgery.

Inhaled Sevoflurane is largely (97%) eliminated from respiration and the remaining is eliminated through the liver and kidneys. Pre-anesthetic blood-work should be done prior to make sure elimination is not harmful to your pet's health.

How can you pet benefit from Sevoflurane?

Sevoflurane it is less respiratory depressive than other inhalant gasses, this means if your pet is in a deep stage of anesthesia, it can be safely lightened quickly. Therefore patients recovering from Sevoflurane are less likely to show the "drunk" effects of anesthesia. Recovery periods are quicker, reducing the risk of hypothermia, dehydration or other complications of being under anesthesia for too long. Full recovery is complete in about 15 minutes.
